Subject: River Park Work Session on February 7th

Scott Shipley from S2O engineering will be attending the work session on February 7th for the purpose of answering questions posed by the Council and members of the public regarding the River Park and the performance of the wave features. Staff has distilled the questions received in the following and has asked Scott to be prepared to address these:

- 1) Do the wave features perform as was anticipated and intended during the design phase of the project? (i.e. are the waves as big as we expected them to be?). Some community members have expressed that during the design process the waves were described to be bigger than they are. If this was the case, then why so.
- 2) Is there sedimentation occurring at the wave features that must be removed in order for the features to perform as intended? If so, should we expect to remove such sediment on a recurring cycle such as annually or bi-annually? Some community members have suggested that the Town is failing to properly maintain the features and that sedimentation has degraded the size of the waves.
- 3) Would it be possible to modify or improve the features to create larger waves? If so, what would that process look like? Some community members have expressed that they desire, and we should create, waves similar to those in the river park in Salida. It would be useful to describe how our park and river are different or similar to conditions in Salida.
- 4) What should we expect the Rapid Blocks to provide in terms of increased wave size, and for what duration of the river park use season?

These questions will form the basis of our discussion and the Council is invited to elaborate on these or to engage with Staff and Scott on other related matters.

No action or direction from the Council is anticipated during the work session, although Council may choose to take a related action at a future Council Meeting.
