ADOPTION OF AGENDA

PUBLIC COMMENT

Kate Sheldon, 2809 E Haystaker Drive – requested the council to look into wildlife crossing signs using technology to prevent road strikes. Suggested three locations in Eagle for placement and for education on etiquette and respect for wildlife.

Bert Christianson 2448 E Haystaker Drive – provided comments on the last Open Space Committee meeting and Second Gulch discussion. Expressed concern regarding the use of taxpayer money on consultants and their not including public comments expressed at their meetings.

Tom Olden - 1864 Eagle Ranch Road – expressed concern with the town's use of consultants from the front range and the length of ReCode and confusion and increased costs for residents and builders. Expressed concern with electrification and the need for multiple forms of energy to ensure the availability of necessary energy services.

Val Glimp 47 Hollyhock Ct. – requested explanation and concern that there is a continuing debate and discussion on changing the size of vehicles on Second Gulch when the survey results indicated the desire of the public to leave things the way they are.

Chad Lieurance 105 Eagle Ranch Road – updated the town on the broadband project on behalf of Aspen Smart Networks and requested expanding services outside of the town limits.

Robin Thompson presented this item.

Council comments: requested additional signage in Eagle to clearly link the trail through Eagle. Robin stated Kevin Sharkey is looking into this.

Council Member Bodenhemier Open Space & Recreation Advisory Committee – updated that the consultant reviewing community surveys wants to ensure that comments all are being reviewed.

Council Member Grimmer – noted that the Colorado Municipal League is in opposition to Proposition HH.

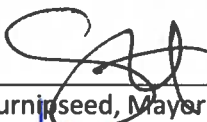

2. Council Committee Updates

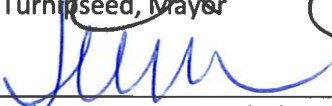
ADJOURN - 6:40 PM
